You will notice that there have been many recent changes to the shelter; most will not affect the volunteer program directly, but there will be some modifications.

- The intake rooms will become a major part of the volunteer program in 2018, and there will be some major changes to the cleaning processes. Those changes will be detailed in new Policy & Procedures and once that is done, then some volunteers will be taught how to do this job to assist the staff.
- Pup room #2 will no longer be a pup room. While I understand why it is happening and why we need the room for a different purpose, I am sad to see that go. As we grow the spay & neuter program, less puppies have been born and this is a great thing. But the Foster program continues to grow and this will be the next hard focus of how to address this issue.
- In 2018 we will need some key adult volunteers who would be willing to help with a couple of new programs we want to roll out. One is the need for a couple of volunteers to be assigned to the Foster Program. This would involve four hour shifts to assist the staff on Wednesdays and Saturdays.
- Secondly, we want to have some adult volunteers who are willing to help release TNR cats into county areas. You would come to the shelter and staff would load up a shelter vehicle and then you would go to areas in the county and release cats that were trapped, sterilized and now need to be released back to their "homes." This also would be a four hour shift. To be eligible for this, you must be at least 21 years of age with active insurance and a driver's license.
