**ANIMAL SERVICES MONTHLY REPORT FOR  
MARCH 2015**

**Program Highlights**

- Volunteers donated approximately 1734.75 hours in March in the areas of animal care (including puppies, cats, general kennels and horses), administration needs, grooming, cleaning, photography, dishes and linens, and several special events. There were 87 active volunteers in March. Of the 1734.75 original hours, 853.50 hours were completed by regular KCAS volunteers, 8.50 hours were completed by one-day volunteers, 21 hours were completed by employment preparation volunteers, 143.50 hours were completed by regional occupational center volunteers (ROC students from the Kern High School District), and 708.75 hours were completed by work release volunteers. Total volunteer time equates to 11.4 staff members and the value given back to KCAS by current and new volunteers in all areas is \$42,811.31.
- March was a busy month once again for media contact, inquiries and interviews for the Department. The Marketing & Promotions Associate responded to 33 media inquiries and requests providing information to the media on various topics such as field services including wildlife calls; "4<sup>th</sup> Annual Cheers for Chihuahuas" adoption promotion, including a live remote with KBAK 29; "4<sup>th</sup> Annual Find Your Lucky Charm" adoption event; vaccination clinics; spay/neuter resources, Wings of Rescue flights, and the department's low-income voucher program. Of those 33 contacts, 12 resulted in interviews or postings for newspaper, television and radio media outlets via video, newsprint on the news agency websites and papers and, on Facebook pages.
- The "4<sup>th</sup> Annual Find Your Lucky Charm" adoption event was held at all three shelters to encourage the public to come out and support the shelter and adopt a new best friend. 36 animals were adopted during the event including 6 cats and 30 dogs. Each adoption for dogs and cats was reduced to just \$17 in honor of St. Patrick's Day.
- The Department's "4<sup>th</sup> Annual Cheers for Chihuahuas" adoption promotion was also held during the entire month of March. The event seeks to encourage the adoption of the many Chihuahuas that come through the doors each month and highlight the need for adoptive homes. Adoption fees for Chihuahuas were reduced to just \$25. This year's month long promo resulted in 62 Chihuahuas finding new forever homes.
- The Rescue Team focused on coordinating animals for 3 flights during the month of March. Together, working with the medical team, the rescue team sent a total of 152 animals on 3 flights to Washington and Idaho. Rescue partners saved an additional 141 animals, for a grand total of 293 animals saved in March.
- Our Foster Program continues to grow and save more lives. 28 new animals entered the foster care program during the month of March.

- Starting July 1, 2013, the Department implemented its first ever Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) program for feral and free-roaming cats, joining thousands of other agencies across the country embracing TNR as the humane method to control the feral and free-roaming cat populations. The program has been extremely successful with 137 cats being spayed or neutered and returned to the areas where they were trapped in March. The total number of cats that have been altered since the beginning of the program is 2,932.
- KCAS hosted two successful, low-cost vaccination, licensing and microchip clinics in Lamont (Lamont Park) and Mojave (Mojave East Park). 219 licenses, 223 Rabies vaccinations, 233 DHPP vaccinations, 8 FVRCP vaccinations, and 134 free microchips were implanted during these vaccination clinics.
- The Department's new Wednesday evening vaccination, licensing and microchipping clinics at the new Fruitvale Shelter location in Bakersfield continued in March with 239 DHPP vaccinations, 12 FVRCP vaccinations, 212 Rabies vaccinations, 211 licenses and 101 microchips issued during the four Wednesday evening clinics.
- Department staff and volunteers participated in the Camelot Park Easter Bunny Trail event with an information booth and adoptable pets. Thanks to the hard work of staff and volunteers, 4 dogs found their forever home at the event.
- We continue to provide free microchips for all pet owners both onsite at all three shelters and at our low-cost clinic locations. We have implanted a total of 8,538 microchips for Kern County residents since the program began on October 23, 2012.
- The Department's medical team was extremely busy this month performing 49 spays and 55 neuters on site for a total of 104 surgeries performed.

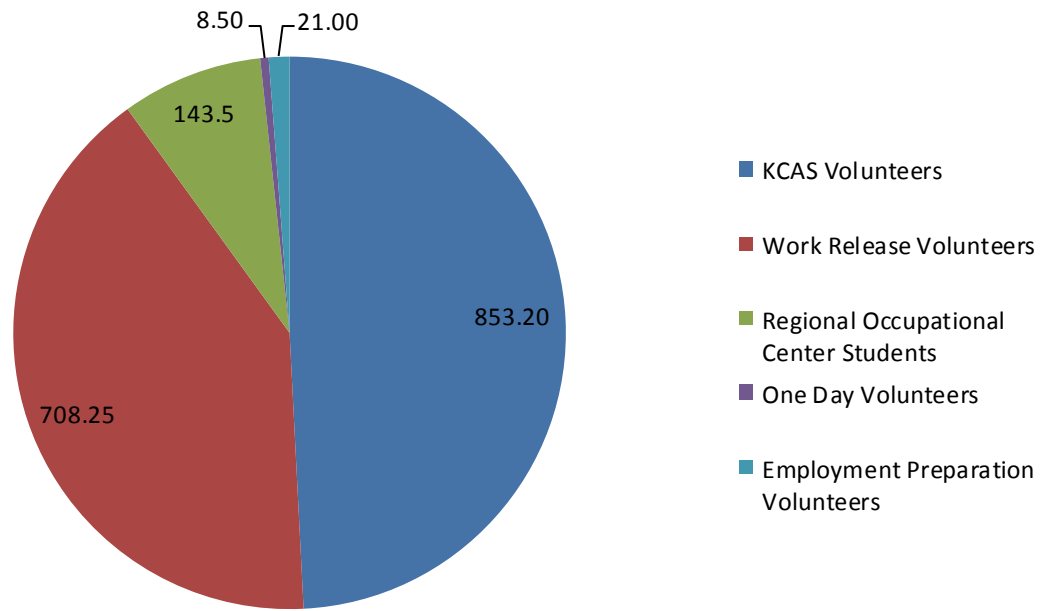
