- 7. Is there shelter from rain or snow in each enclosure?
- 8. Are the enclosures sufficiently well drained?
- 9. Is the whelping area separate from the other kennel areas?
- 10. Is a play yard available?
- 11. Is there an isolation area for sick animals?
- 12. Is a source of clean potable water available at all times for all animals?

- 13. Is there adequate lighting in all kennel areas?
- 14. Is there sufficient staff to provide proper care for the numbers of animals on the premises?
- 15. Are all areas free from objectionable odors?
- 16. Are all areas reasonably clean and sanitary?
- 17. Are appropriate chemicals used for regular sanitation?
- 18. Are cleaning protocols adequate to disinfect and sanitize the entire facility, including feed/water bowls, enclosures, and any other items the animals may come in contact with?
- 19. Is food properly labeled and kept in rodent/pest proof containers?
- 20. Are facility records available upon request?
- 21. Is there a facility evacuation plan in place?
